

What to Expect

Home learning is not just “homework” or “busywork.” Home learning deepens and strengthens student learning when valuable class time can be put to better use. For example, reading an article or watching a video at home prepares students for a discussion or activity to be carried out in class.



- Students should expect weekly home learning (reading) while preparing for literature club discussions.
- Passion Projects may require time at home, especially in meeting deadlines throughout the year (interviewing experts, project application and final presentation).
- Math at the middle school level requires 30-40 minutes at home per night, four nights a week.

What to Expect

During Theme, students are generally given enough time to complete tasks during class time. However, on occasion, students may have home learning when:

- Preparing for a lesson activity or discussion
- Preparing for assessments and creating final products to showcase their learning
- Completing a task after not optimizing use of time provided in class

How Home Learning Prepares Students for High School
